5. However, as per regulation 3(3) of MSR, 2016, the college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of permission for the academic year 2024-25. Hence the Board decided to issue the 3rd Renewal of Permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25.
6. Therefore, 3rd Renewal of Permission is granted to Shri Basaveshwara Ayurvedic Medical College, hospital and Research Centre, Shadabad Road Kalaburgi - 585105, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0625) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25, subject to the condition that college is fulfilling the following conditions as mentioned below: -
 - I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
 - II. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 60 seats** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted there-under.**
 - III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
8. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
10. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:**

- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
 - iv) The shortcoming mentioned in Point no. 4.
11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
